Africa is not ... a country!





Some facts on Africa (1)



- Population: ~1,000M (15% of world population)
- Telephone subscriptions: 1.3% (mobile: 69%)
 - World average: 16% (95.5%); Europe: 39% (125%)
- Internet penetration: 19%
 - World average: 40%; Europe: 75%
- Mobile broadband subscriptions: 19%
 - World average: 32%; Europe: 64%
- 7% HigherEd gross enrollment rate (world average: 29%)
 - Huge demand, but access challenges
 - Massification
 - High student/faculty ratio: 40:1 and more
 - Brain drain



Role of HE, research and ICT

- It is proved and generally accepted that HE critical for socio-economic development
- Sector neglected for more than 20 years in SSA
 - IMF and WB-imposed policies
 - Emphasis on basic and secondary education
- Results:
 - Inadequate infrastructure
 - Massification
 - High Students/Staff ratio
 - Aging faculty
 - Inappropriate qualification of large segment of faculty
- Recent shift in policies
 - Important role of ICTs to achieve objectives (access, quality, ...)

Role of HE, research and ICT (cont'd)

- Access to adequate infrastructure crucial to be part of the cyberspace
- However: bandwidth in Africa still most expensive in the world (up to US\$3,000 per Mbps/month and more)
 - But improving in some countries (\$200 or less)
- Role of IT infrastructure, especially RENs, in African context:
 - Sharing of scarce resources
 - Improvement of access through blended learning
 - Reduction of researchers isolation and creation of critical masses
 - Participation in global research projects
 - Facilitation of contribution of the African Diaspora



African RENs – Brief history

- First RENs in the continent emerged in Eastern and Southern Africa
 - The UbuntuNet Alliance established in 2005, with 5 founding members
 - Currently 14 member NRENs
- West and Central African Research and Education Network (WACREN) established in 2010; more on WACREN later in this presentation
- Arab States Research and Education Network (ASREN)
 - Established in 2012
 - Covers North Africa as well as other countries in the Middle East
 - Current members include 13 NRENs in the ASREN region



WACREN in a nutshell

- Incorporated in 2010 after long process facilitated by the AAU (from 2006)
- Currently 8 formally established NRENs
 - GARNET Ghana
 - snRER Senegal
 - MaliREN Mali
 - Niger-REN Niger
 - GabonREN Gabon
 - NgREN Nigeria
 - TogoRER Togo
 - RerBenin Benin
- NREN embryo in Cameroon
- Recent initiatives in Chad, Guinea and Cape Verde
- Potential NREN membership: 22

Network topology





Network topology (cont'd)

- Core + Access
 - 10G+ Core
 - IG+ Access
- 3 main hubs: Accra, Dakar and Lagos (+ Douala/Libreville)
- Redundant links from hubs to NRENs
- At least 2 intl. links: to Paris and London
- Multiple Submarine Cable Access
- Long term IRU's where possible

Recent developments



- 1st AGM in July 2013 in Abuja, Nigeria
 - New Chair of the Board of Directors
 - Appointment of CEO (effective 1 October 2013)
 - Search process for other Board members
- New Board of Directors in September 2013
- 1st Annual Conference and 2nd AGM in March 2014 in Lomé, Togo
 - Good participation from community, friends and partners
 - New membership structure
 - Fundraising campaign
- First regional training workshop: Sep 2014 in Accra
- Some countries very close to having their NRENs operational
 - Expectation that at least 2-3 NRENs will be operational by the end of 2014



Status of NRENs in the region

- RITER (Côte d'Ivoire)
 - 3 universities interconnected
 - 2 in the process of being connected soon
 - 10 lecture halls equipped for videoconferencing
- GARNET (Ghana)
 - The 17 members agreed on network topology
 - Contract with operator signed
 - Implementation by end of 2014
- Niger-REN (Niger)
 - Interconnection of 9 institutions to start soon
 - Collaboration with SokREN (Nigerian REN cluster)

Status of NRENs in the region (cont'd)

- NgREN (Nigeria)
 - About 30 institutions connected to NOC
 - Commissioned in July 2014
 - 102 others universities and 17 teaching hospitals to be connected within the next year
- snRER (Senegal)
 - Interconnection of the 5 public universities completed
 - Videoconferencing equipment already installed in all these institutions
 - International connectivity in procurement process
- TogoRER (Togo)
 - 5 member institutions
 - Objective: NREN to be operational by end of 2014



WACREN activities

- AfricaConnect (capacity building component)
- eI4Africa
 - 3rd thematic workshop hosted by WACREN in Lagos in March 2014
- Participation in JRES 2013 in December 2013
- WACREN Statutory meetings
 - Board meeting on 8 October 2013 (online);
 - Board meeting on 12 March 2014 in Lomé
 - WACREN 2014 Conference on 13-14 March 2014 in Lomé
 - Annual Conference and Annual Conference and AGM
 - 3rd Board meeting on 8 October 2014
- Regional capacity building workshop in Accra (Sep 2014)
- Participation in this Forum



WACREN activities (cont'd)

- Planned activities:
 - Workshop on eInfrastructure for R&E in collaboration with UbuntuNet Alliance and DANTE during IST Africa: Mauritius, 6-9 May 2014
 - 4th thematic workshop of the eI4Africa Project: Dar es Salaam, **3 June 2014**
 - AIS 2014 in Djibouti: 2-6 June 2014 (with AfREN scheduled on 2 June)
 - Training workshop in collaboration with NSRC:
 15-19 September 2014
 - Training workshop in collaboration with RENATER/IRD/CIRAD: November/December 2014
 - Next WACREN Annual Conference and AGM: 11-13 March 2015



Current and short-term focus

- One-year project under current phase of AfricaConnect Project
 - Started in May 2014
- Conclusion of negotiations with operators and provision of affordable connectivity and services to members
- Capacity building
 - Training needs assessment
 - Organization of other training workshops
- Provision of services to members
- Readiness for second phase of AfricaConnect
 - NREN readiness
 - Securing counter-part funding



Partnerships

- MoUs signed with:
 - RENATER
 - UbuntuNet Alliance
 - ASREN
 - Other MoUs in preparation
- Interconnection agreement with GEANT underway
 - Router already installed in London (Cisco/ISOC donation)
- Ready for cross-connect with UbuntuNet Alliance and ASREN
- Partnership with NSRC on capacity building activities
- WACREN open to other partnerships
 - Including interconnection with APAN



AfREN

- Platform for experience sharing and collaboration on research and education networking
- Organized by the African REN community in collaboration with AfNOG (African Network Operators Group) and AfriNIC (the regional Internet registry for Africa)
- First edition in 2007 in Abuja, Nigeria
- Strong support from the academic community, especially through the Association of African Universities (AAU)
- Integral part of the AfNOG/AfriNIC annual conferences, now rebranded as Africa Internet Summit
- Good participation from Korea at the last edition in Djibouti (Prof. Dae Young Kim, Prof. YoungHee Lee and Prof. Taekyoung Kwon)
 - Interest in AfREN from Korea started with earlier participations spearheaded by Prof. Kilnam Chon.
